- 1. Check out the front cover**
Does it make you want to find out more about the book?
- 2. Drawn in by what you see?**
Read the blurb on the back - does it make you want to read the book?
- 3. The first page check**
Does the first page make you want to carry on reading the rest of the book?
- 4. Get reading or have another go at finding the right book for you!**
- 5. Still stuck? Get a recommendation**
Ask a friend, family member, teacher or librarian to recommend a book they enjoyed.
- 6. Swap:**
Even with good choosing strategies, sometimes a book is just not right, and that's ok. Becoming an independent and more confident reader is about knowing when a book is not right for you. So give it a go, don't give up too soon, but if you are just not enjoying it, choose something else - there's a better book out there for you!

WORLD BOOK DAY

So many books, how do I choose?

A Love to Read Resource

Becoming more confident at choosing books you will enjoy is an important skill that takes time to master and needs to be practiced! We suggest these six strategies next time you choose your next book.

- 1. Think**
What type of book are you in the mood for? Something to make you laugh, something which is familiar or completely new, a book which is exciting, or something to help you learn new things? Books offer us all types of amazing experiences. Before choosing a book, think about what type of experience you are looking for!
- 2. Choose:**
There are many different strategies you can use to choose a book. For example, you can look at the front cover, the illustrations, read the blurb on the back, read the first few pages or random pages within the book. You can choose based on genre, author or book series, or choose based on a recommendation by someone or a review. You may try several of these strategies at once. Try using different strategies and see what works best for you.
- 3. Support:**
There will be lots of others in your class and school who enjoy reading the same things as you do - support each other by recommending books to each other - you can share preferences by telling about them or writing short reviews/recommendations to display in your class or school.
- 4. Ask:**
Your teacher and other school staff will have had lots of experience of choosing books. Ask them what strategies they use, or if they'd recommend any books for you. If you are struggling to find a book you like, ask them for help.
- 5. Look:**
Look at how books are displayed in your class reading spaces or school library. Learn how books have been organised so you can choose more easily based on genre (e.g., funny, exciting) or topic (e.g., sports, animals). Help your teacher to organise these displays to support reading choices, look out for written reviews from others, and consider displaying your own reviews too!
- 6. Swap:**
Even with good choosing strategies, sometimes a book is just not right, and that's ok. Becoming an independent and more confident reader is about knowing when a book is not right for you. So give it a go, don't give up too soon, but if you are just not enjoying it, choose something else - there's a better book out there for you!

The spring bulbs are now starting to reappear and the children will soon be busy sowing seeds and planting vegetables again in the school garden.



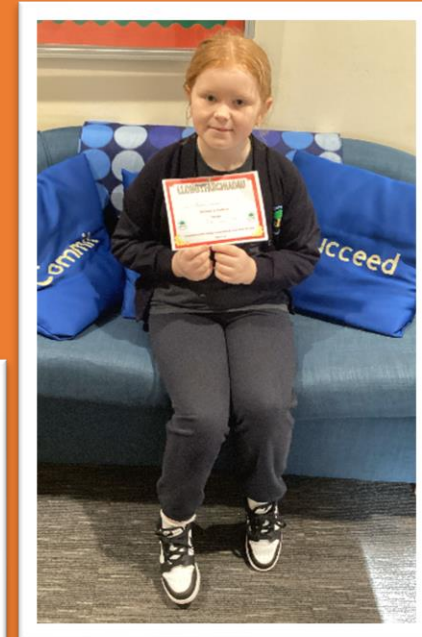

Attendance: RESPONSIBILITIES OF PARENTS

Parents can do a great deal to support the regular and punctual attendance of their child. Parents should:

- Ensure a good home routine is in place to prepare their child for the following school day (for example, school bag packed, uniform ready, an age-appropriate bedtime routine, a good early morning start including breakfast).
- Ensure that their child arrives at school on time each day.
- Inform the school on the first day of their child's absence and keep the school regularly updated throughout the absence period.
- Ensure explanations for absences are a true reflection of the circumstances to enable schools to offer support to improve attendance.
- Expect contact from school regarding any unexplained absence of their child.
- Expect and be open to support from the school in order to improve their child's school attendance.
- Be aware that action can be taken in law to address unauthorised absence from school including a Fixed Penalty Warning notification at 5 days' unauthorised absence, followed by a Fixed Penalty Notice for 10 days or more unauthorised absence, an Education Supervision Order or parental prosecution.
- Schools will not approve holidays during term time. Only in exceptional circumstances will the Headteacher be in a position to consider the reasons for requesting holiday approval following the Exceptional Circumstance rule*. (Welsh Government Directive).

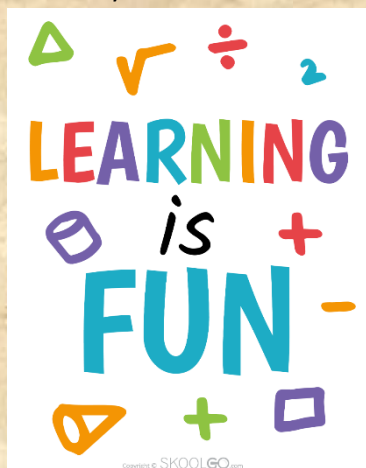
LEARNING IS FUN by Megan Dawkin

TAG RUGBY By Riselda Begaj

I am interested in this story because I play TAG rugby and it is my favourite sport. We practise on Wednesdays with some of our classmates and friends with Mr Batterbee.

We are going to a rugby festival on the 20th February and we have been practising for this event for a long time. This is going to be our second festival of the year and we are all very excited. We are going to Rhyl Rugby Club and we will be competing with different schools around North Wales. The festival has been organised by the Urdd.

Here are some interesting facts about TAG Rugby.

Each Player should have two tags, worn on a belt around their waist. You are not able to use contact in TAG Rugby and you have to try and grab the tag of the opposite team player. The Rugby World Cup is one of the most popular sporting events.

TAG rugby is a minimal contact version of Rugby, generally played in a 7-a-side format. Players are not allowed to surrender. A penalty will be awarded to the opposition if the attacking team gathers the ball not having travelled 10 metres. You are also not allowed to run directly at the defenders. The Centurion Tag Belts are designed for TAG rugby and it is an ideal game for very young and junior players, as well as a constructive, non-contact training aid for seniors and other age groups. It is played by 200,000 players in organised leagues across the country. Players are permitted to spin away from a defender, but are not permitted to continuously spin.
