Going back to school

Advice for parents on keeping safe on the journey to school



Have you thought about how you will get your children to and from school when it is time to return? Are you considering changing the way you travel?

Sustrans' Active Journeys programme is aware many families have been enjoying walking, running, scooling and cycling as part of their daily exercise. It's a great opportunity to keep this going when schools go back. Our surveys show that pupils would prefer to travel actively if they were given the choice. The surveys we carry out with pupils, for example, show that over one-third of pupils want to cycle to school and a massive majority are positive about travelling actively.

Children enjoy being active. They arrive at school fresh and ready to learn. The streets around school are safer with less congestion. It's healthy for us all and it's also good for the planet (and doesn't create air pollution around the school). It's a chance to chat and share things as a family.

Many of us have experienced how we can maintain distance from others while travelling actively, including making use of the quieter roads even if that is to briefly step into them to move around people. Hopefully we can keep travelling actively, but the roads may get busier, so there is some advice overleaf so we can do this safely.

We think active travel will be an important tool in tackling Covid-19. Collectively we will be healthier and stronger. Studies have linked sevently of Covid-19 symptoms to poor air quality, which is made worse if there is lots of traffic around the school.

Advice on Social Distancing on the Journey to School

When schools return, the pavements and roads may become busier again. Here are some ideas to help you feel comfortable travelling actively to school:

- Give yourself a bit more time in the morning. People walking, running, scooting and
 cycling tend to arrive at school over a longer time period. This makes it easier to
 manage limited space on the roads and paths around school.
- Vary your route if you can. This can be more interesting and pleasant, especially if you
 can stay away from busy roads. Try and find the route less travelled.
- Stop and wait for people to pass (and say hello). Look for wider areas of the path, for example at junctions and feel confident about using other people's driveways so people can pass.
- Remind children about slowing, stopping and giving space, especially if they are scooting and cycling. They might make mistakes, but try not to get angry, just remind them that it's really important right now.
- If you do have to step in the road to pass people, reinforce looking and listening with
 your family. Looking and listening is how we understand the world around us, so the
 more looking and listening we do by the roads the better decisions we make.
- Try and give older children (Y4 and above) responsibility for getting themselves to and from school. You might prefer to arrange to meet them near the school (outside the library or a shop). This helps their road confidence and reduces the amount of people arranged the school.

What You Can D

If you live too far away to travel actively or don't feel it is possible for you, please try and park and stride, ideally using an off-street car park, perhaps 5-10 minutes away from school. That way, your children still get the benefits of active travel.

If you think the footpaths are not wide enough, talk to the school's head teacher and your local authority. Many local authorities have an online resource where you can report problems directly to their Highways team. It may be possible to reallocate road or parking bay space as has happened elsewhere in the country. There may be opportunities to widen footpaths, try pop-up cycle lanes and close the roads around schools to traffic during drop-off and pick-up times. It is your ideas that make it happen.

MESSAGE FROM THE SITE MANAGER

As we will be returning to full school occupancy in September, the school site once again will become very busy in the mornings and afternoons with traffic. We shall be returning to normal operations concerning school access and traffic management when the new term begins. The school drop off car park on Nant Hall road is the only area to be used for parents dropping off pupils, or short-term parking. Spaces are limited here but Tesco provide free parking and is just a short walk from the school gates. The designated drop off area has a waiting time of just 2 minutes only. Please don't park in this area if you need to enter the grounds for any reason. The car park on Ffordd Parc Bodnant is for staff and official school visitors only. The security gates will be closed and no access is available at this entrance. Our traffic arrangements are as a result of the school Traffic Risk Assessment and Traffic Management Plan which are a statutory requirement. The intention is to make the school site as safe as possible for all users and your co-operation is appreciated.

Proposed Return to School in September

On Thursday 9th July 2020, the Education Minister, Kirsty Williams, published details of the next phase for schools in Wales, with an expectation that all children return to school from Monday 14th September. As a cluster of primary schools, we hope to be able to get all children back into school before that date, with the majority of children attending school full time from Thursday 3rd September (details below).

Your child's safety and wellbeing are our priority and we have now received the guidance required to help us to plan and prepare for this next phase. We are delighted to have already agreed our initial plans and considerations, prioritising wellbeing of learners, staff and families to plan an approach that is right for our community.

We understand that you will have many questions and we are working closely with the Local Authority and governors so that we can provide you with the information you need to prepare for this return. Between now and September will be very busy as we work to complete our risk assessments and prepare the school site. Some of the detail listed below is subject to change as we receive more guidance or the situation with regards to the virus changes over the coming weeks.

When we begin to open to more learners from September it is likely that:

Teaching and Learning

- The full curriculum will not initially be in operation but we will focus on wellbeing and learning skills.
- We will continue to focus on teaching good hygiene and routines in the coronavirus world. This will include an induction on how all learners must now operate and behave in school during these unprecedented times.
- Our aim is to provide an education for all learners and a sense of routine/normality.
- There will also be pastoral and wellbeing sessions to foster good mental health within lessons.

Arrangements during the school day

- Learners will be split into contact groups (bubbles) within their classes and year groups.
- Each contact group will have their own classroom space for the day they
 attend school and any mixing with other groups will be minimised.
- Classrooms will be organised to maximise the distance between learners.
- We will insist on regular handwashing and hand sanitising throughout the day.
- Uniform will be compulsory.

Term Start Dates:

- Thursday 3rd September and Friday 4th September All children return to their old
 classes for 2 days. For example, if your child was in year 3 last year you will drop
 off in the year 3 drop off area below for these 2 days. We feel it would benefit
 learners to have 2 final days with their previous teachers to say goodbye and to
 ensure that the move to the new class is as smooth as possible.
- The staff car park will not be open for learners. Please use the parent car park.

The Daisy Chains entrance is now called the Early Years entrance.

Behaviour

- The normal school rules and expectations on behaviour and conduct will apply.
- Any pupil not following the social distancing rules will be removed from school and parents will be contacted to collect their child.

Start and finish times

- The start and finish times are as shown above.
- Attendance at school will be compulsory for all children unless they have a medical/health reason to do so. This will include learners who are still shielding, if the advice at the time is that they should attend school.
- Learners must not arrive at school any earlier or later than the time slot allocated.
- All learners will have a designated entry and exit point into and out of school, please see above.

No adults can accompany learners into school. Only school staff and learners
will be allowed in the school building and parents and learners must maintain
social distancing when on the school site. Parents may be asked to leave the
school site if they are unable to maintain appropriate social distancing.

Breaktime and lunch times

- Breaktimes and lunchtimes will be staggered so that each contact group has their own space. Learners from other contact groups will not mix during these times.
- The school kitchen staff will provide meals for anyone who wants one (for the usual charge). Orders for food will be placed earlier in the day.
- There is a further option that you can take you child home for lunch and return them to school please see below times. Please advise the class teacher if you would like to take your child home for lunch.

COVID -19

- If your child, or any members of your household, display any symptoms of Covid-19 they MUST NOT attend school.
- If a pupil does develop symptoms they will be isolated immediately and we will insist
 on them to be picked up as soon as possible.
- We will not be taking pupil's temperatures on arrival as the science shows that many children with coronavirus are asymptomatic.
- PPE has not been advised in schools except when administering first aid and for our cleaners. It might be that some learners and staff choose to wear facemasks.
- It is important that the school holds up-to-date contact numbers for all children so
 please contact school with any new contact numbers before your child attends.
- If a child soils themselves it may be necessary to contact a parent/carer to collect them to reduce the risk of infection.
