Some primary school children could begin a phased return to school from 22 February -

just after half term if Covid rates continue to fall, Wales' first minister has said.

Ministers have been under pressure to set out their plans for a return to face-to-face teaching.

Most schooling has been online while Wales has been in lockdown. Mark Drakeford also said the tough "alert level four" restrictions would remain for another three weeks.

He told the Welsh Government's Friday coronavirus briefing that if infections continue to fall "we want to see children able to return to school after half-term from 22 February, starting with the youngest in our primary schools".

"Our children and young people have had a torrid time, over the last 12 months, they are missing out on education, every week," he said.

He added the Welsh Government will also work on proposals for older pupils and college students who have to do vocational examinations "to return to school and colleges in a phased and flexible way after half-term".

We should have some more news after 19th February when the government meet again.



BODNANT COMMUNITY SCHOOL AWARDED PLATINUM STATUS FOR A 3rd TIME

We have been awarded the prestigious Platinum Flag Award after previously gaining three Green Flag Awards thanks to the environmental education programme, Eco-Schools.

Eco-Schools is an international programme run in Wales by environmental charity, Keep Wales Tidy and funded by the Welsh Government.

The Eco-Schools programme inspires and empowers pupils to be leaders of change in their community, helping them learn about sustainable living and global citizenship while giving them the information and support they need to make changes that will benefit their school, local environment and wider community, such as reducing waste, energy consumption, transport, biodiversity, healthy living and litter issues. Well done all.

Home Learning

Now that we are three weeks into home learning, I feel it is a good point to reflect on how things are going. We are very grateful to all families for engaging in home learning at a very difficult time.

Expectations: There are no set expectations from the Welsh Government about how and what schools should be sending home for children to do. The guidance they have produced says that schools must consider how **all** our children will be able to access the learning. This means that we are trying our best to send activities which will be accessible for **all** our children based on our own knowledge of their academic needs.

As you can imagine, this presents a huge challenge for staff. Our key thought in all this is to provide a balance between the essential learning skills that the children would be taught in school and also the well being of our families so that they are not sitting in front of a screen for hours on end. We are also able to print out work for families which are struggling to access technology at home. If you have requested work from school please visit the school reception where you can collect it.

<u>Unique home environments</u>: Everyone's home circumstances are different. There are so many factors which affect whether work can be completed. The type of devices children have access to, what level of support parents are able to give, parents' working patterns, siblings competing for devices, having siblings of different ages in different classes or different schools. All these factors vary in each house. Home is not like school, which means that not every child can log on at 9am every day. We have found that there are huge variations in when children are able to complete their activities. Because of this, we get very different requests. Some parents have requested more work, while other parents from the same classes have asked for less!! It all depends on your own family circumstances. What is achievable in one house, might be difficult in another! We just try to offer a balance the best way we can.

I encourage you to have a dialogue with your class teacher through SeeSaw who will be understanding of all circumstances and maybe provide some ideas or alternatives.

The best advice I can give you is to not worry. If your child is getting upset or finding the work difficult, it is not worth getting into a battle or putting yourselves under pressure. Please just message the teaching staff if there is something you would like to discuss or get advice about. We are trying to adapt as we go along, so if you feel you need clarification on any of the work, please let the teachers know. They will be happy to help and reassure! 
